Fiscal Year 2023

The federal government's decades-long partnership with leading research universities, like Rutgers, has advanced technological innovation, improved public health and well-being, fueled the American economy, and strengthened our society. During FY 2023, faculty, staff, and students at Rutgers were supported by more than \$500 million in federally sponsored grants and contracts.

As New Jersey's land-grant institution, Rutgers researchers utilize Department of Agriculture funds to breed disease-resistant varieties of fruits, vegetables, and nuts to benefit the state's agricultural economy. Rutgers researchers have also partnered with the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to improve forecasting for major storms, like hurricanes. From biomedical research on COVID-19 testing and vaccines, as well as personalized cancer therapies funded by the National Institutes of Health, to research sponsored by the Department of Defense to create more efficient body armor for our military servicemembers, Rutgers continues to be New Jersey's research titan.
